

Alberta Economy

Indicators at a Glance

Economic Activity

In 2016, Alberta's real GDP by industry fell by 3.8%, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row. The Alberta Activity Index was up 1.9% in March, building on steady improvements since bottoming out in May of last year.

NEW: Population

Alberta's population was 4,291,980 as of March 1, 2017, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.2% from a year ago.

NEW: Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 4,693 in the first quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 7,085 net international migrants. However, there was a net outflow of interprovincial migrants (-2,392), the sixth consecutive quarterly decline.

Employment¹

Alberta added 2,100 jobs in May. The gains were in full-time positions (+18,900) while in part-time positions (-16,700) were down. Employment increased 1.8% year-over-year (y/y).

Unemployment Rate¹

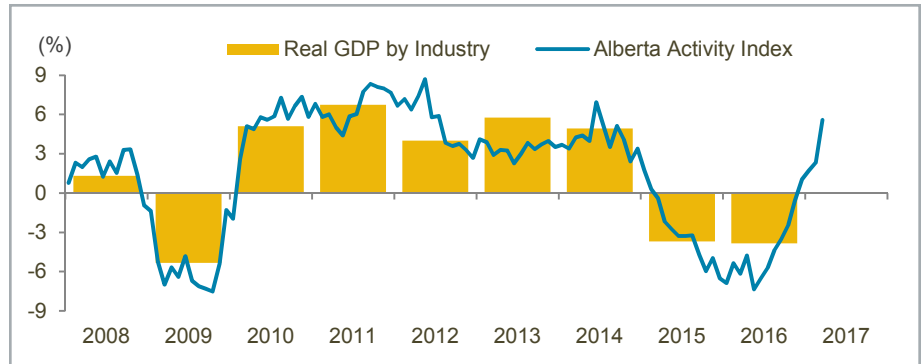
Alberta's unemployment rate ticked down 0.1 percentage points to 7.8% in May. Canada's unemployment rate edged up to 6.6%.

Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 61 in May, about 70% below the height of the winter drilling season in January but up 144% from the same month last year.

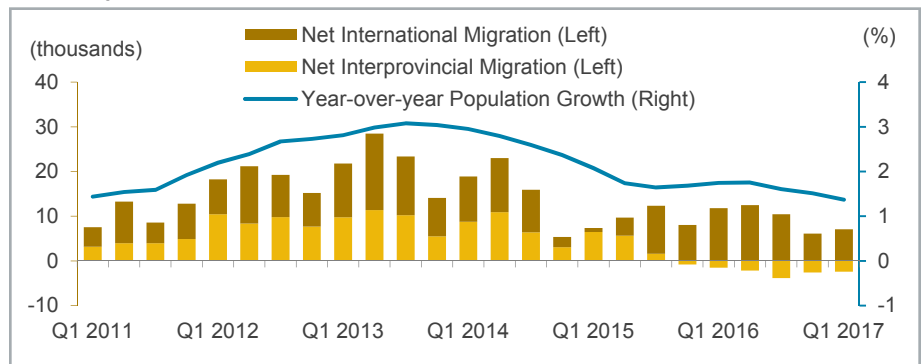
Year-over-year % change

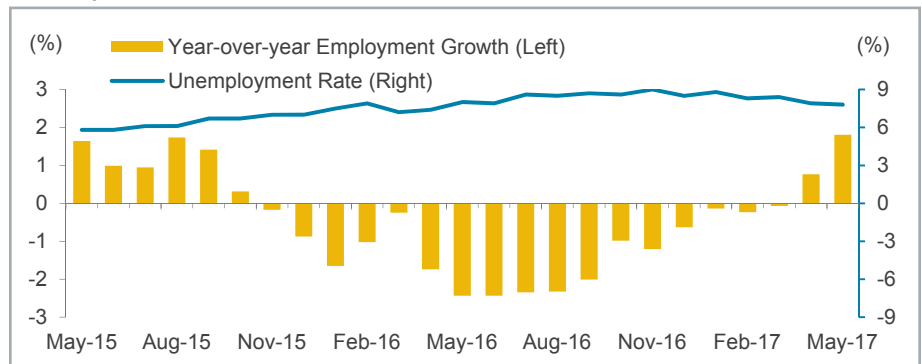

Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 1.7% y/y in April. Gasoline prices were up 20% y/y while food prices (-1.3% y/y) and rent (-1.6% y/y) fell.

Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta increased 0.8% in March to \$1,118. Gains in service sector earnings (+1.1% m/m) outweighed a modest decline in the goods sector earnings (-0.4% m/m).

Retail Sales¹

Following seven uninterrupted monthly gains, Alberta retail sales decreased by 0.5% m/m to \$6.6 billion in March. Retail sales grew 7.2% y/y, the fourth consecutive month of gains.

Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts were up 4.0% m/m in May to 32,707 units (annualized). Housing starts increased 48% y/y. Single-family starts rose 47% y/y and multi-family starts were up 57% y/y.

New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) edged down 0.1% in April and was down 0.5% y/y. The house-only component was down 1.2% y/y, while land prices were up 0.8% y/y.

Building Permits¹

Alberta building permits decreased 11% m/m in April to \$1.0 billion. Building permits were down 22% y/y. Non-residential permits dropped 43% and residential permits declined 3.7% y/y.

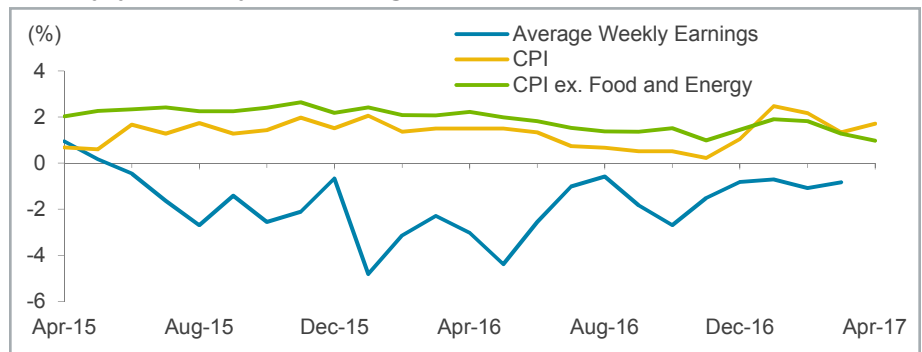

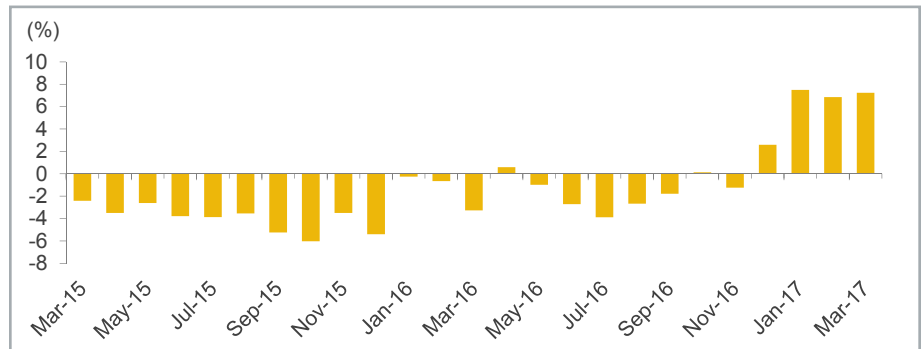
Monthly, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

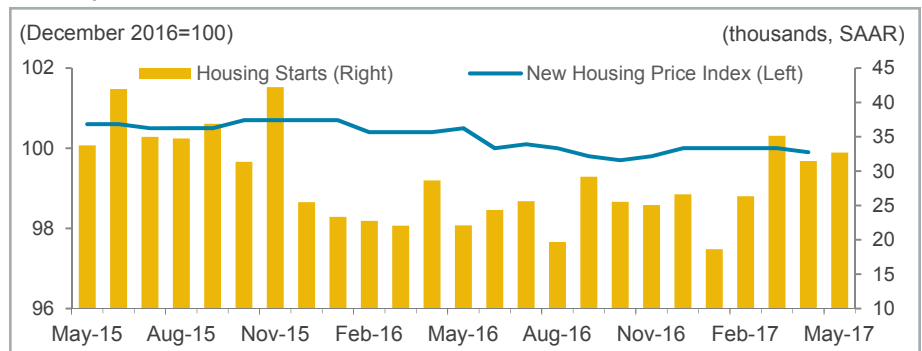
Monthly, year-over-year % change

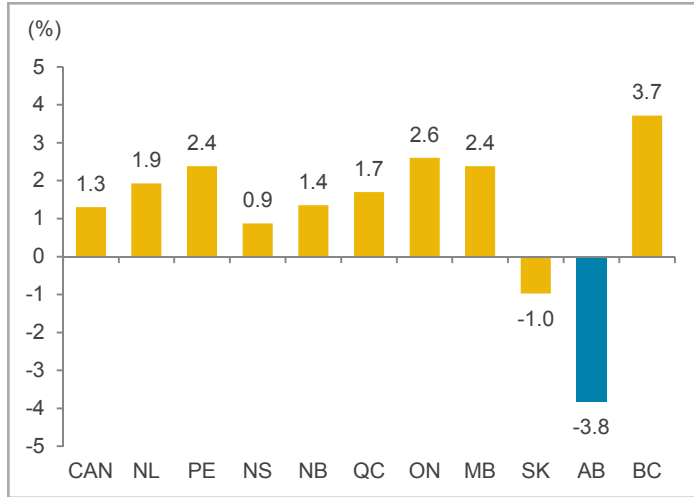

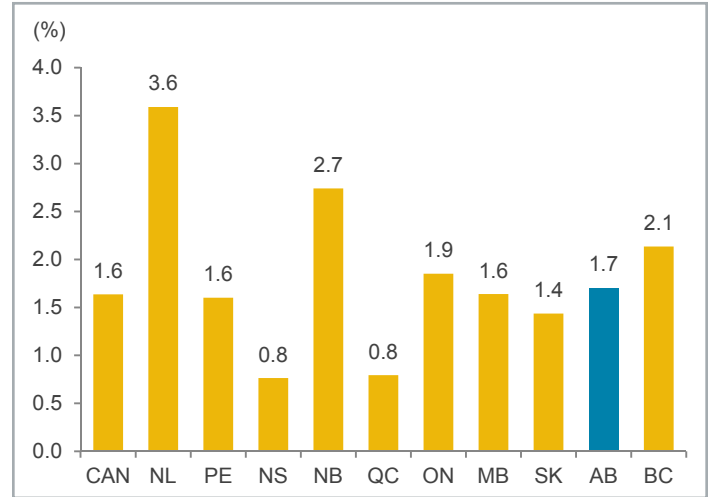
Real GDP by Industry

(2016, year-over-year growth)



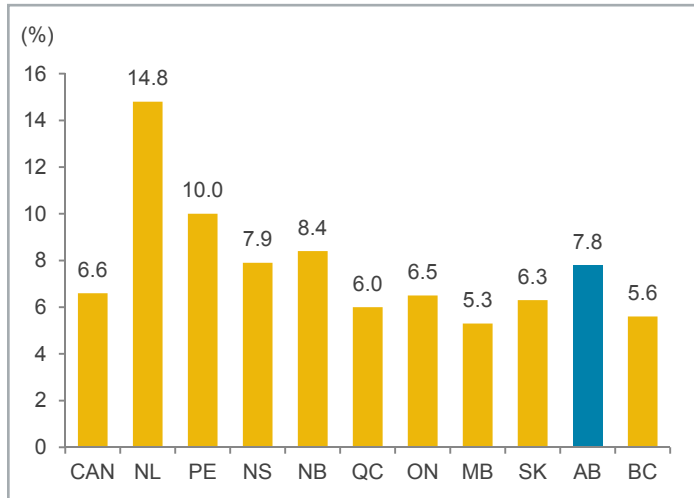
CPI Inflation

(April 2017, year-over-year growth)



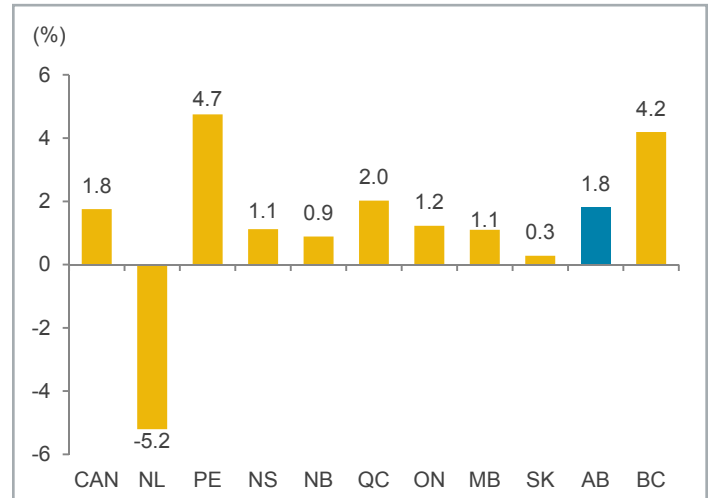
Unemployment Rate

(May 2017)



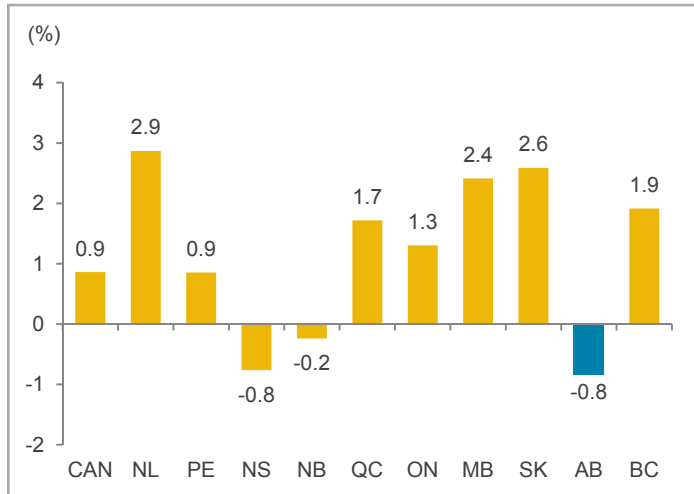
Employment

(May 2017, year-over-year growth)



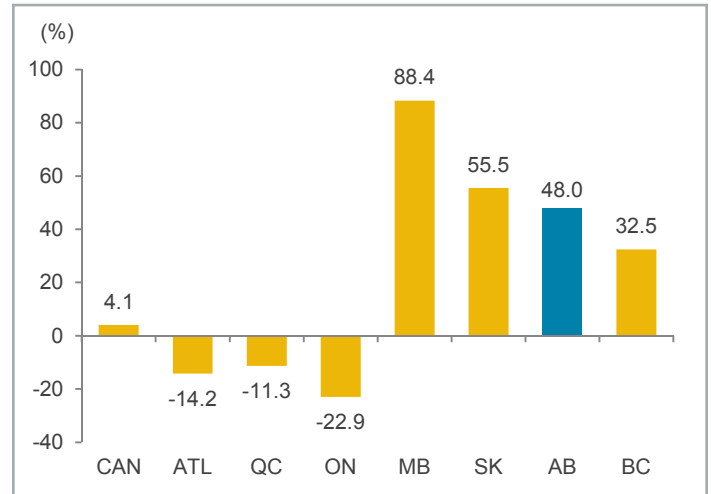
Average Weekly Earnings
