

# Alberta Economy

## Indicators at a Glance

### Economic Activity

In 2016, Alberta's real GDP by industry fell by 3.8%, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row. The Alberta Activity Index held steady in April and has climbed 7.6% since the bottom reached in May 2016.

### Population

Alberta's population was 4,291,980 as of April 1, 2017, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.2% from a year ago.

### Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 4,693 in the first quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 7,085 net international migrants. However, there was a net outflow of interprovincial migrants (-2,392), the sixth consecutive quarterly decline.

### NEW: Employment<sup>1</sup>

Alberta added 7,500 jobs in June. The gains were in part-time positions (+18,800) while full-time positions (-11,400) were down. Employment increased 2.2% year-over-year (y/y).

### NEW: Unemployment Rate<sup>1</sup>

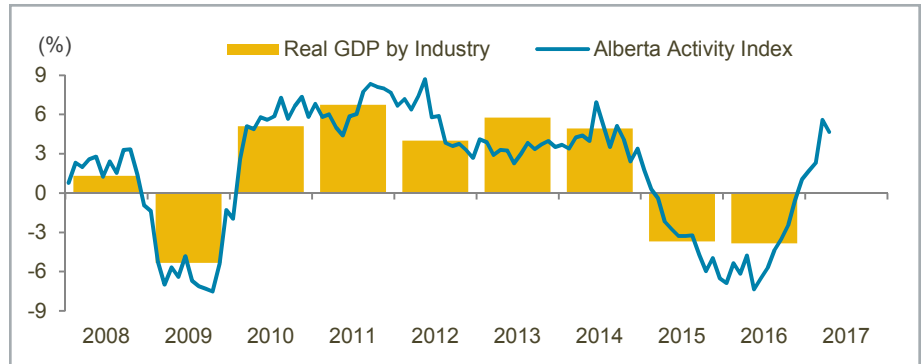
Alberta's unemployment rate ticked down 0.4 percentage points to 7.4% in June. Canada's unemployment rate went down to 6.5%.

### Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 87 in June, 56% below the height of the winter drilling season in January but up 113% from the same month last year.

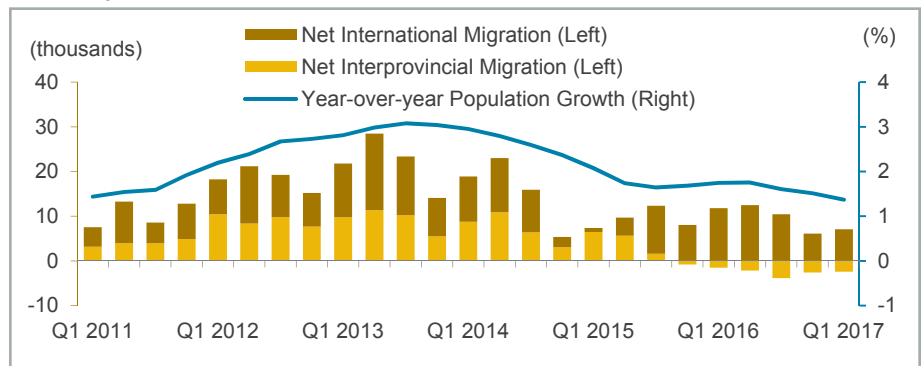
Year-over-year % change

### Demographics

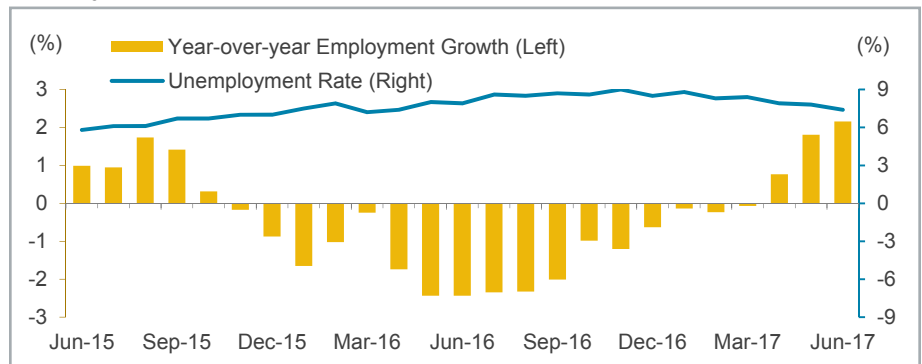

### Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 1.2% y/y in May down from 1.7% in April, as energy prices declined. The Canadian inflation rate also fell in May to 1.3%.

### Average Weekly Earnings<sup>1</sup>

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta grew by 0.6% in April to \$1,126. Both goods (+0.4% m/m) and service sector earnings (+0.7% m/m) posted gains.

### Retail Sales<sup>1</sup>

Alberta retail sales increased by 0.5% m/m to \$6.7 billion in April. Retail sales grew 6.0% y/y, the fifth consecutive month of gains.

### Housing Starts<sup>1</sup>

Alberta housing starts were up 4.0% m/m in May to 32,707 units (annualized). Housing starts increased 48% y/y. Single-family starts rose 47% y/y and multi-family starts were up 57% y/y.

### New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) edged down 0.1% in April and was down 0.5% y/y. The house-only component was down 1.2% y/y, while land prices were up 0.8% y/y.

### NEW: Building Permits<sup>1</sup>

Alberta building permits increased 18% m/m in May to \$1.2 billion. Building permits were up 16% y/y. Non-residential permits dropped 5.3% y/y and residential permits increased 34% y/y.

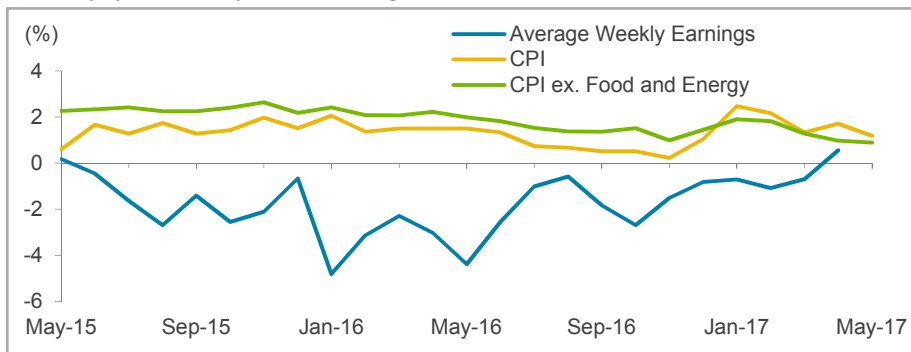

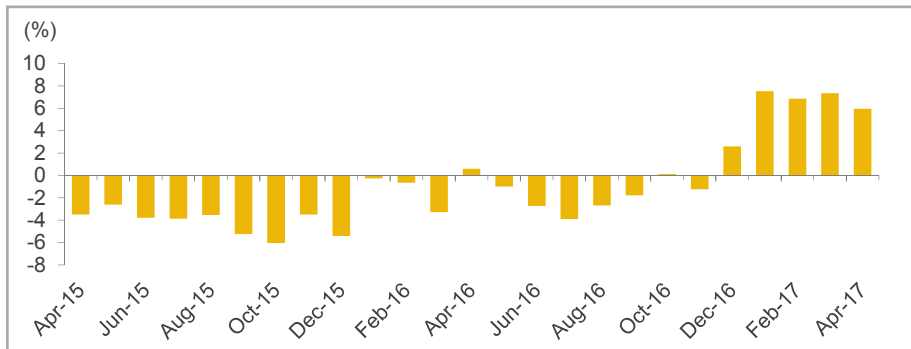
Monthly, year-over-year % change

### Retail Sales

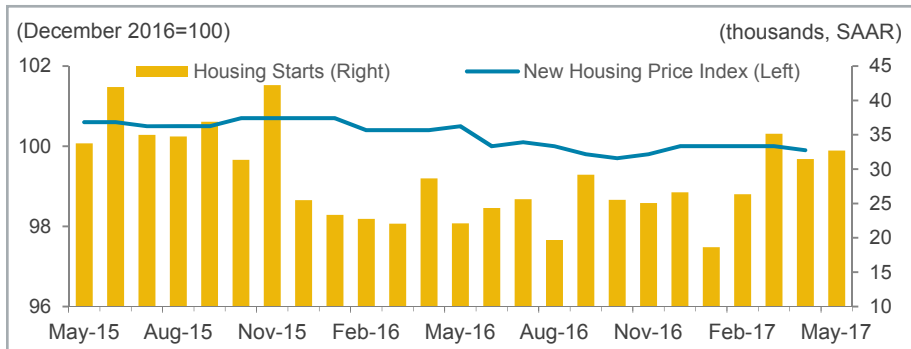
Monthly, year-over-year % change

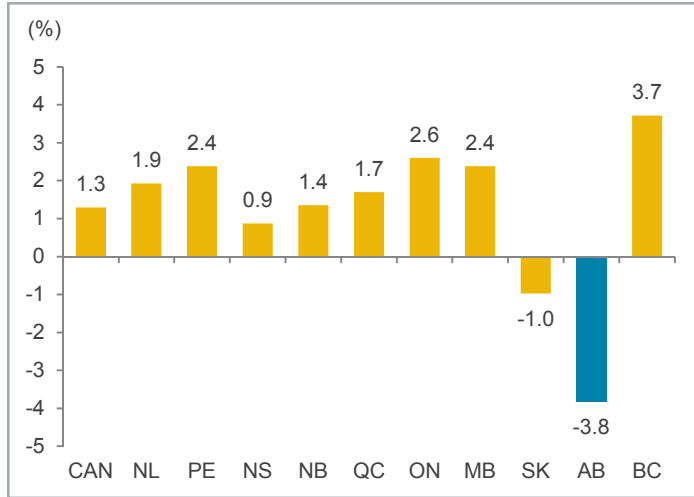

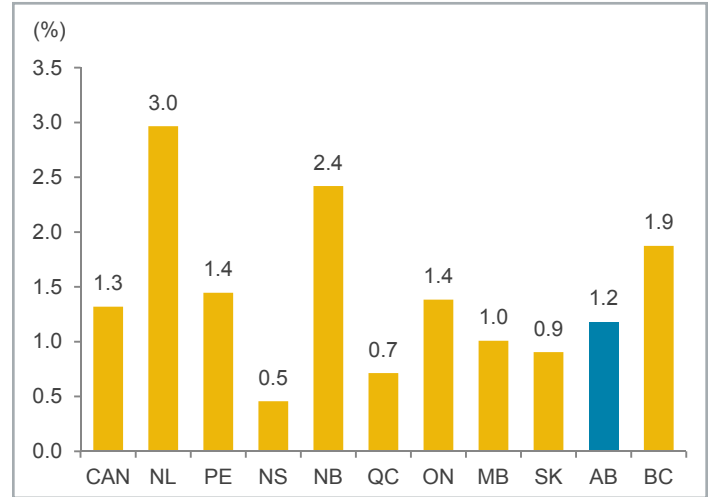
**Real GDP by Industry**

(2016, year-over-year growth)



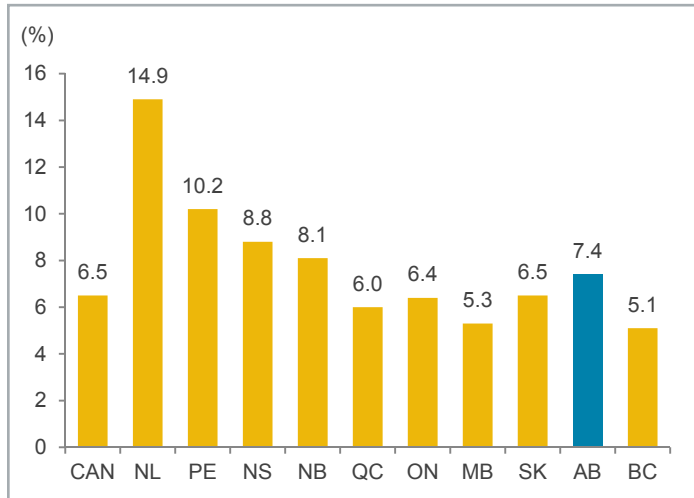
**CPI Inflation**

(May 2017, year-over-year growth)



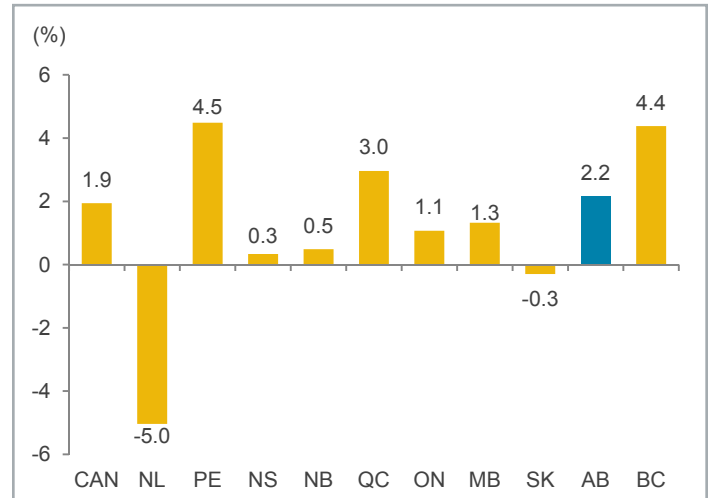
**Unemployment Rate**

(June 2017)



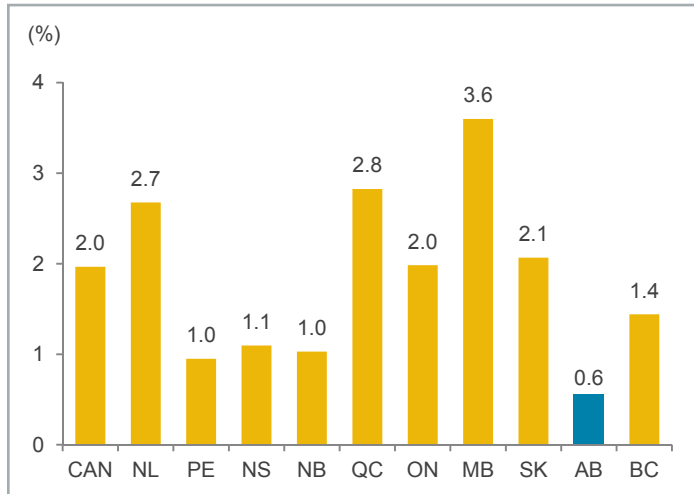
**Employment**

(June 2017, year-over-year growth)



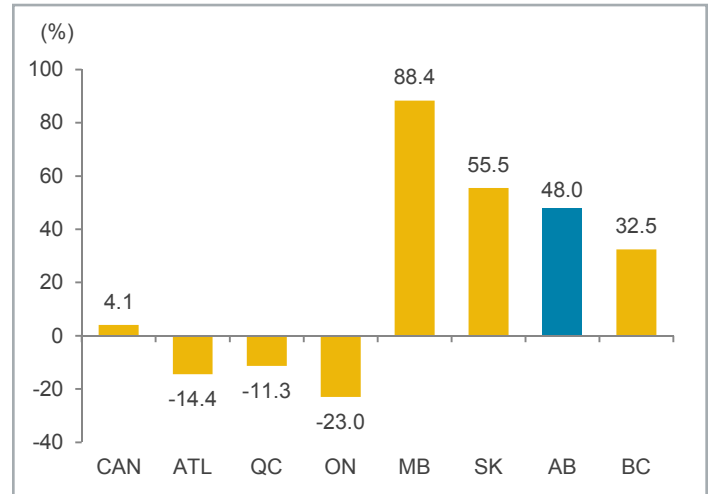
**Average Weekly Earnings**
