

Alberta Economy

Indicators at a Glance

Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index jumped 2.2% in May, and has climbed 10% since its May 2016 low. In 2016, Alberta's real GDP by industry fell by 3.8%, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row.

Population

Alberta's population was 4,291,980 as of April 1, 2017, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.2% from a year ago.

Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 4,693 in the first quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 7,085 net international migrants. However, there was a net outflow of interprovincial migrants (-2,392), the sixth consecutive quarterly decline.

Employment¹

Alberta lost 14,400 jobs in July, with losses in both part-time (-2,200) and full-time positions (-12,200). Employment increased 1.5% year-over-year (y/y).

Unemployment Rate¹

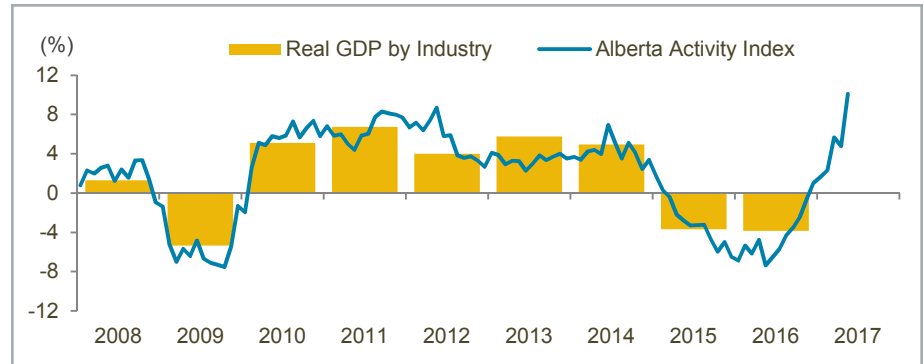
Alberta's unemployment rate increased 0.4 percentage points to 7.8% in July. Canada's unemployment rate ticked down 0.2 percentage points to 6.3%.

Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 119 in July, 40% below the height of the winter drilling season in January but more than double the same month last year.

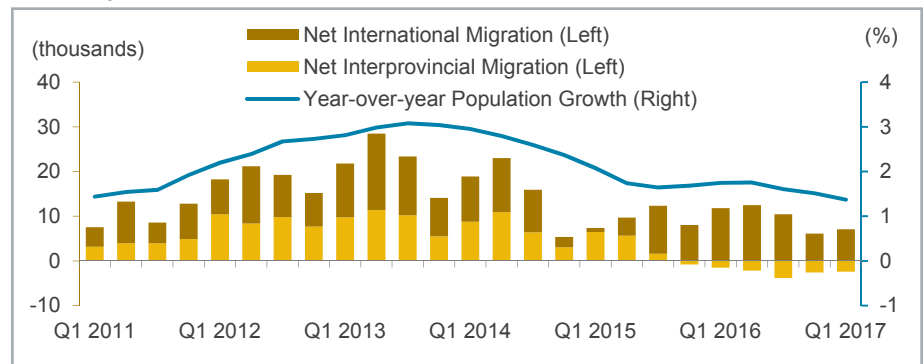
Year-over-year % change

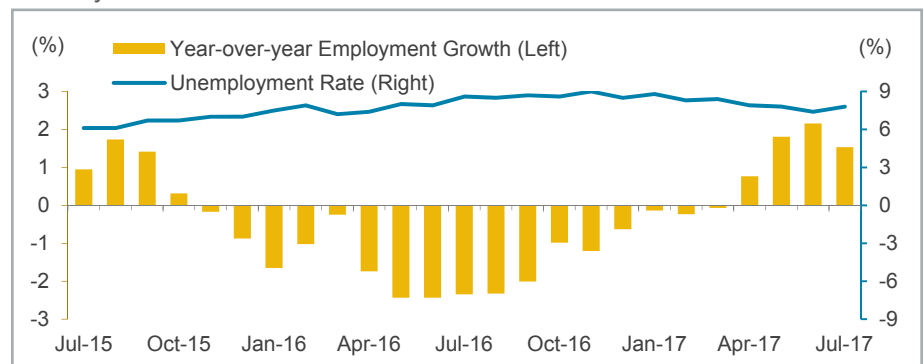

Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 0.4% y/y in June, down from 1.2% in May, as energy prices declined. The Canadian inflation rate also slowed in June to 1.0%.

Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta fell by 0.4% in May to \$1,120, with both goods (-1.4% m/m) and service sector earnings (-0.1% m/m) declining.

Retail Sales¹

Alberta retail sales increased by 1.6% m/m to \$6.8 billion in May. Retail sales grew 9.0% y/y, the sixth consecutive month of year-over-year gains.

NEW: Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts were up 8.1% m/m in July to 33,535 units (annualized). Housing starts increased 31% y/y. Single-family starts rose 43% y/y and multi-family starts were up 27% y/y.

NEW: New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) edged down 0.1% in June and was down 0.4% y/y. The house-only component was down 0.6% y/y, while land prices were unchanged from the year prior.

NEW: Building Permits¹

Alberta building permits were down 8.0% m/m in June to \$1.1 billion. Building permits were up 10% y/y. Non-residential permits dropped 7.9% y/y and residential permits increased 23% y/y.

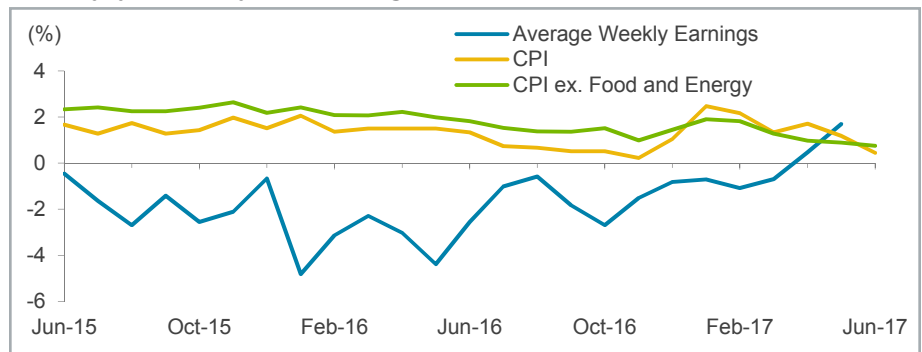

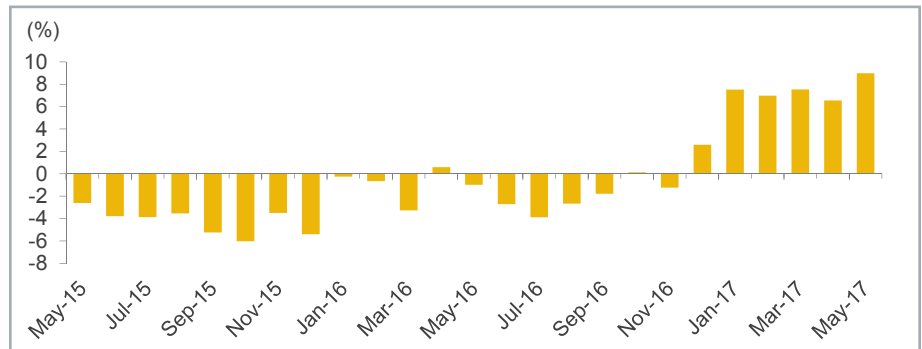
Monthly, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

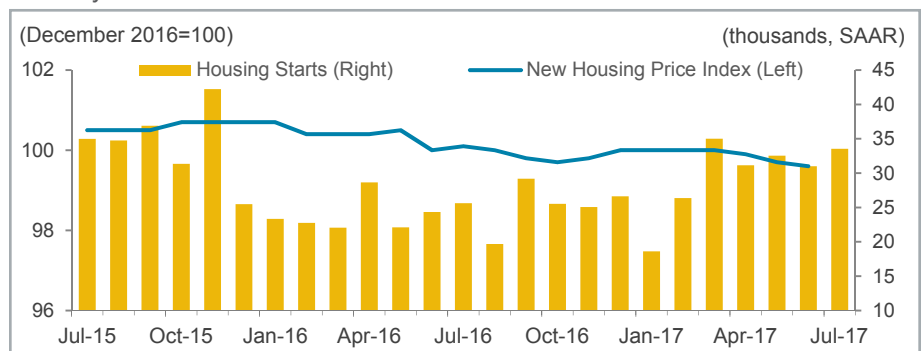
Monthly, year-over-year % change

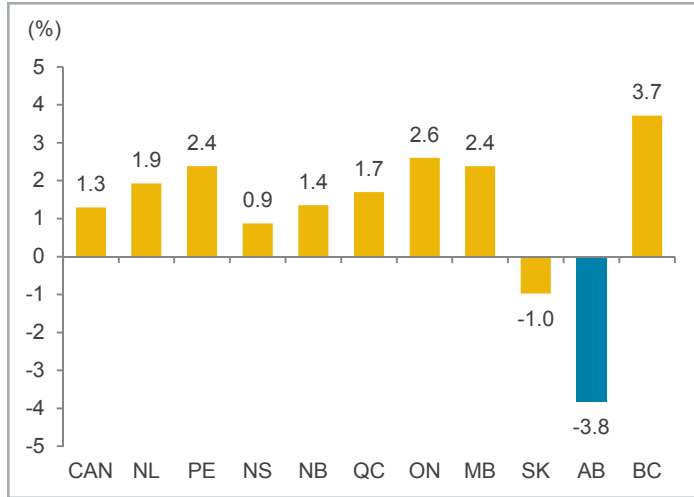

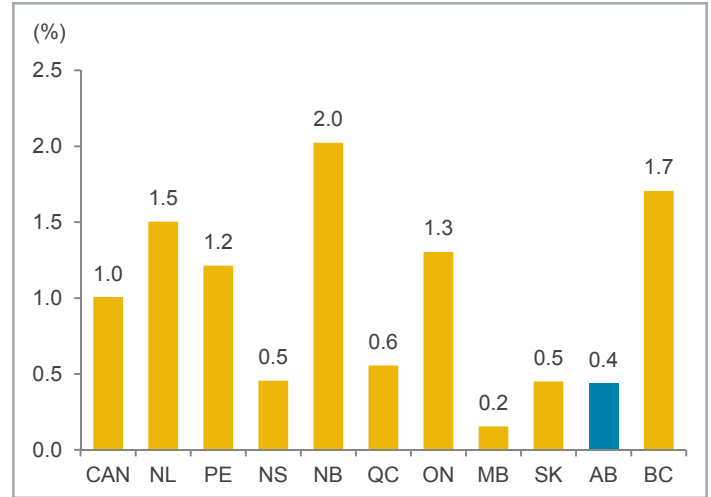
Real GDP by Industry

(2016, year-over-year growth)



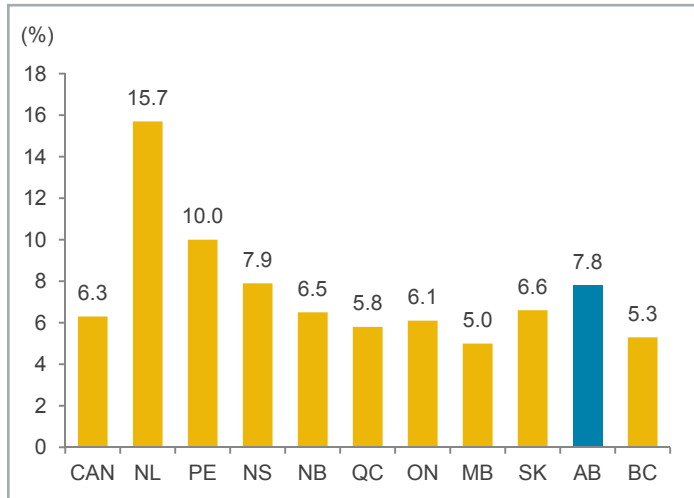
CPI Inflation

(June 2017, year-over-year growth)



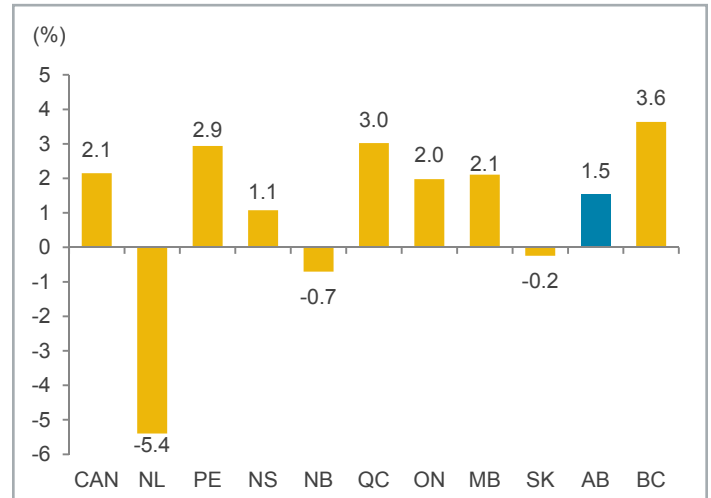
Unemployment Rate

(July 2017)



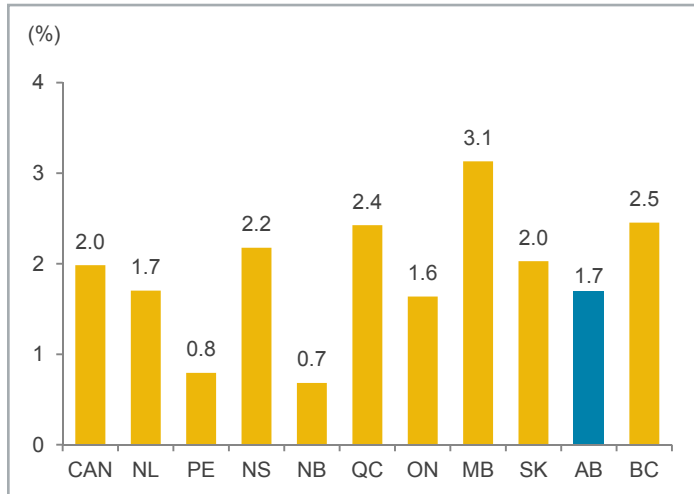
Employment

(July 2017, year-over-year growth)



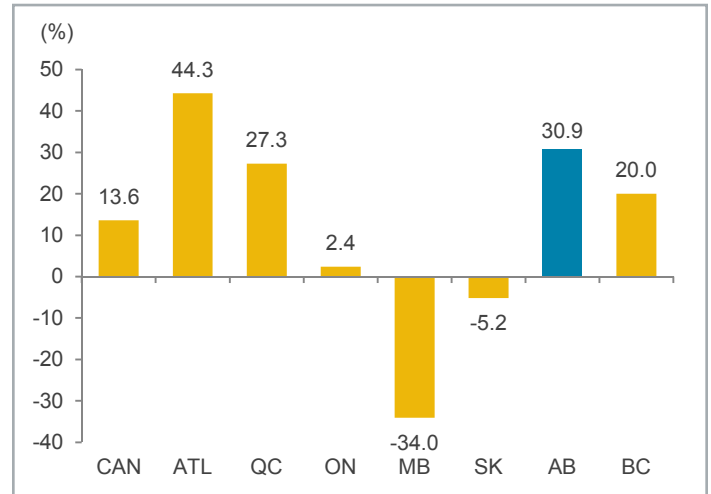
Average Weekly Earnings
