

Alberta Economy

Indicators at a Glance

Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index eased 0.4% in June but continues to improve over last year's levels up 7.7% y/y. In 2016, Alberta's real GDP by industry fell by 3.8%, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row.

Population

Alberta's population was 4,291,980 as of April 1, 2017, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.2% from a year ago.

Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 4,693 in the first quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 7,085 net international migrants. However, there was a net outflow of interprovincial migrants (-2,392), the sixth consecutive quarterly decline.

NEW: Employment¹

Alberta added 2,300 jobs in August, mainly due to an increase in full-time positions (+7,600), offset by a decline in Part-time positions (-5,400). Employment increased 1.5% year-over-year (y/y).

NEW: Unemployment Rate¹

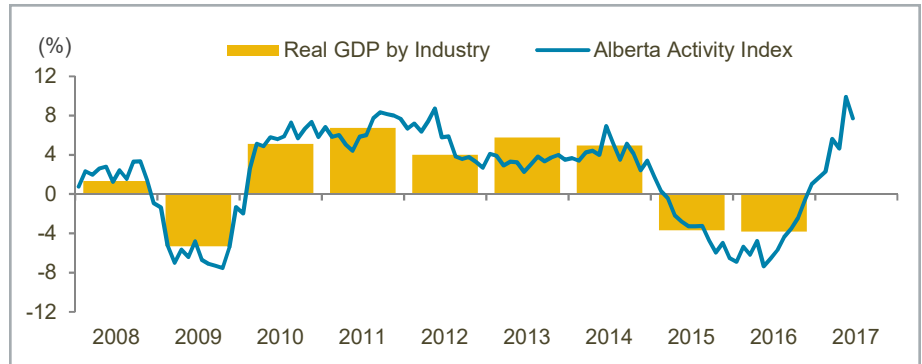
Alberta's unemployment rate increased 0.3 percentage points to 8.1% in August. Canada's unemployment rate ticked down 0.1 percentage points to 6.2%.

Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 126 in August, up 67% y/y. Year-to-date, the number of active rigs has average 127, double the amount in 2016.

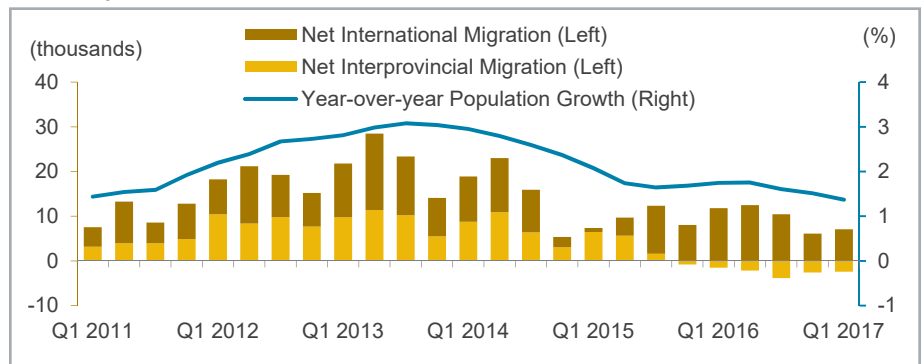
Year-over-year % change

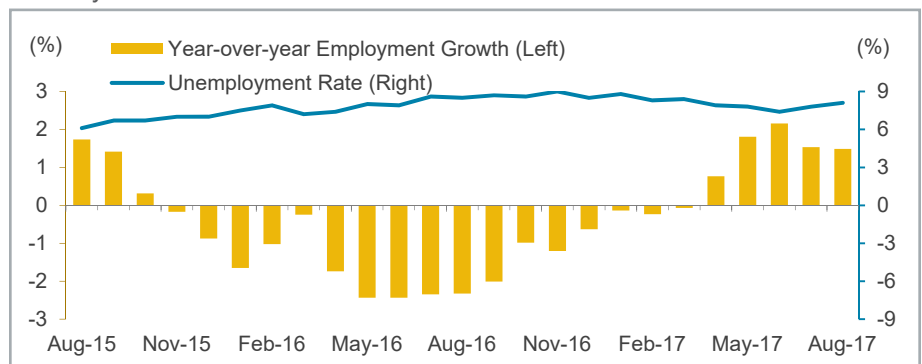

Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 1.0% y/y in July, up from 0.4% in June, as energy prices increased. The Canadian inflation rate also ticked up in July to 1.2%.

Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta rose by 1.8% in June to \$1,132, with both goods (+2.0% m/m) and service sector earnings (+1.2% m/m) increasing.

Retail Sales¹

Alberta retail sales increased by 1.0% m/m to \$6.9 billion in June. Retail sales grew 10.5% y/y, the seventh consecutive month of year-over-year gains.

Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts were up 8.1% m/m in July to 33,535 units (annualized). Housing starts increased 31% y/y. Single-family starts rose 43% y/y and multi-family starts were up 27% y/y.

New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) edged down 0.1% in June and was down 0.4% y/y. The house-only component was down 0.6% y/y, while land prices were unchanged from the year prior.

NEW: Building Permits¹

Alberta building permits were down 6.5% m/m in July to \$1.0 billion. Building permits were down 9.0% y/y. Non-residential permits dropped 30% y/y and residential permits increased 9.3% y/y.

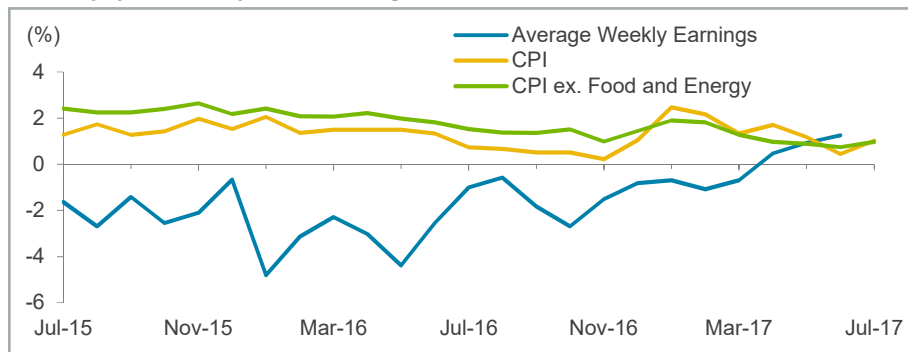

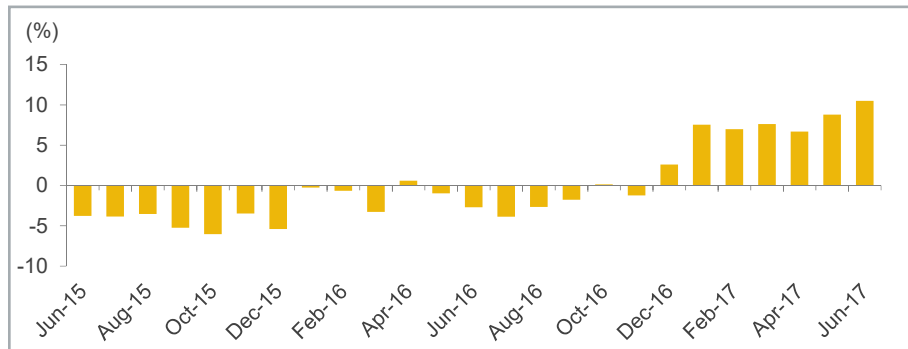
Monthly, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

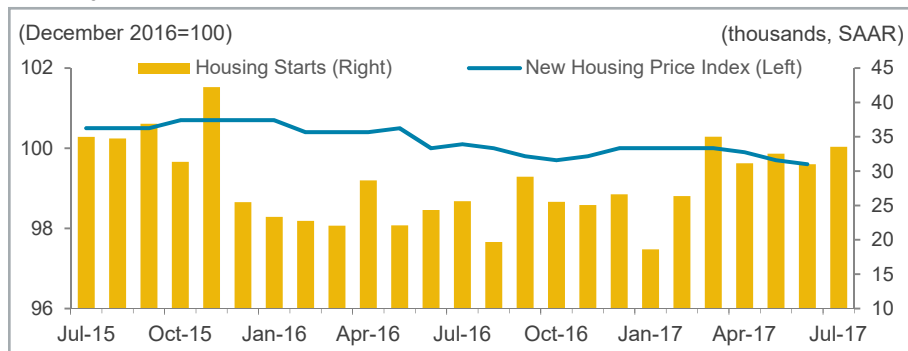
Monthly, year-over-year % change

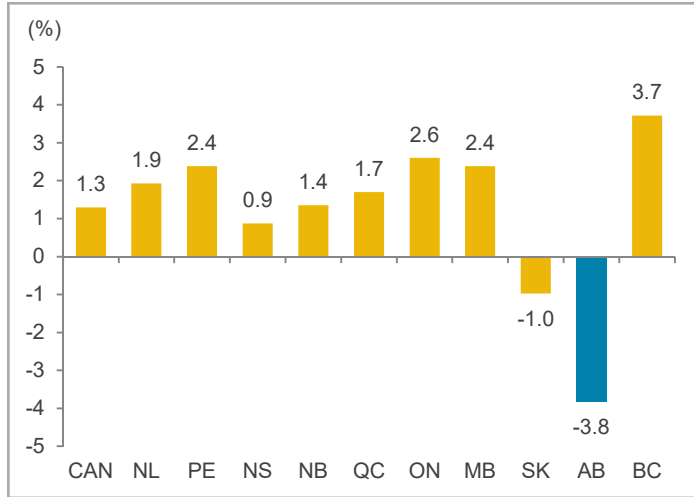

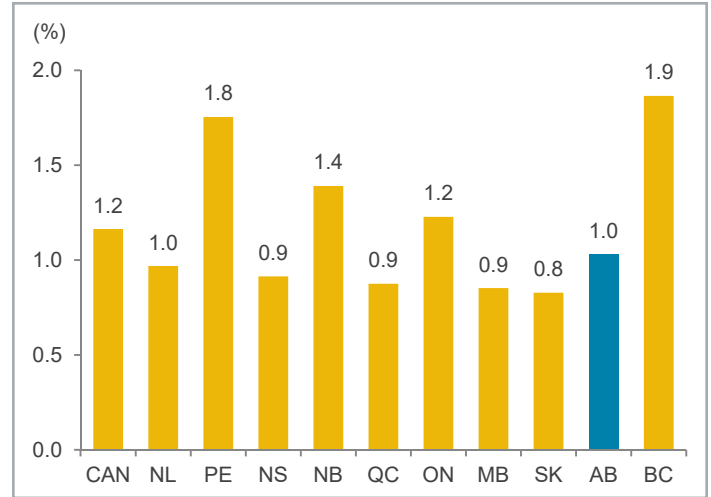
Real GDP by Industry

(2016, year-over-year growth)



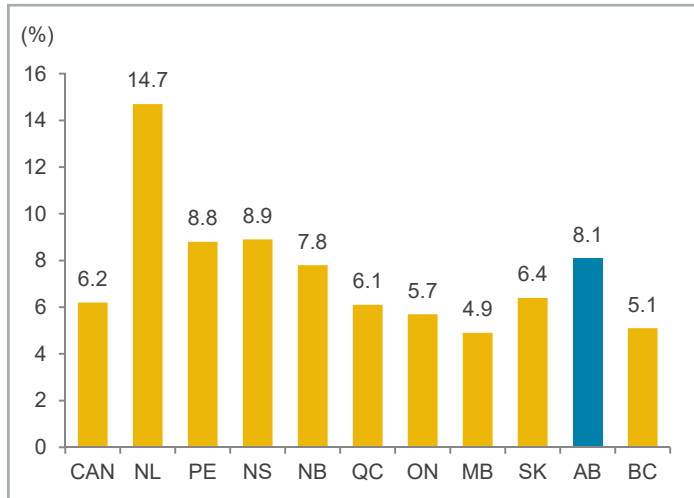
CPI Inflation

(July 2017, year-over-year growth)



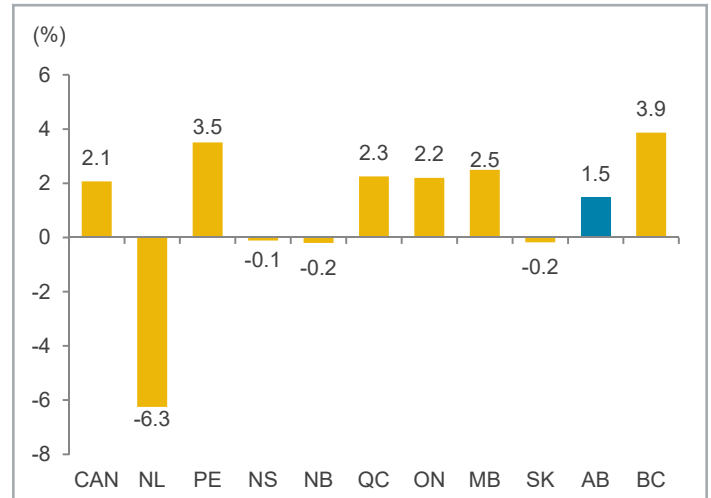
Unemployment Rate

(August 2017)



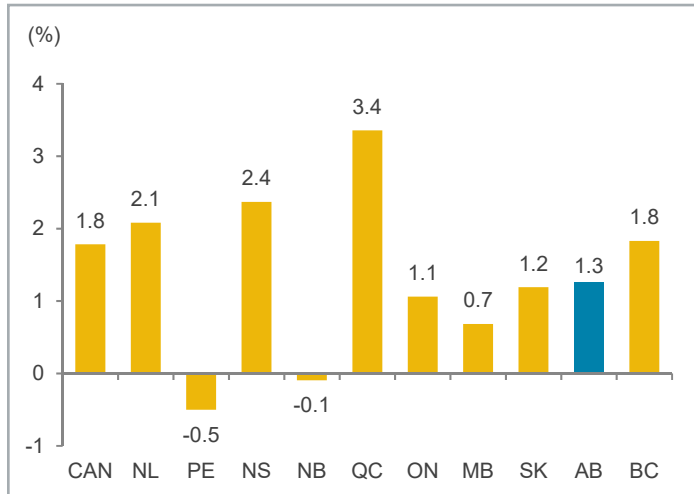
Employment

(August 2017, year-over-year growth)



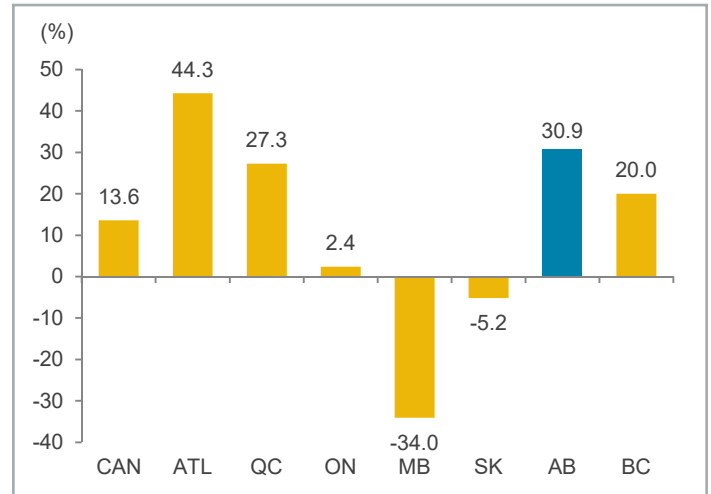
Average Weekly Earnings
