

# Alberta Economy

## Indicators at a Glance

### Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index fell 1.0% in July but continues to improve over last year's levels, up 6.3% y/y. In 2016, Alberta's real GDP by industry fell by 3.8%, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row.

### Population

Alberta's population was 4,286,134 as of July 1, 2017, an increase of 1.2% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.2% from a year ago.

### Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 5,486 in the second quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 10,400 net international migrants. However, there was a net outflow of interprovincial migrants (-4,914), the eighth consecutive quarterly decline.

### NEW: Employment<sup>1</sup>

Alberta lost 7,800 jobs in September as part-time job losses (-9,900) were partially offset by an increase in full-time positions (+2,300). Employment increased 0.6% year-over-year (y/y).

### NEW: Unemployment Rate<sup>1</sup>

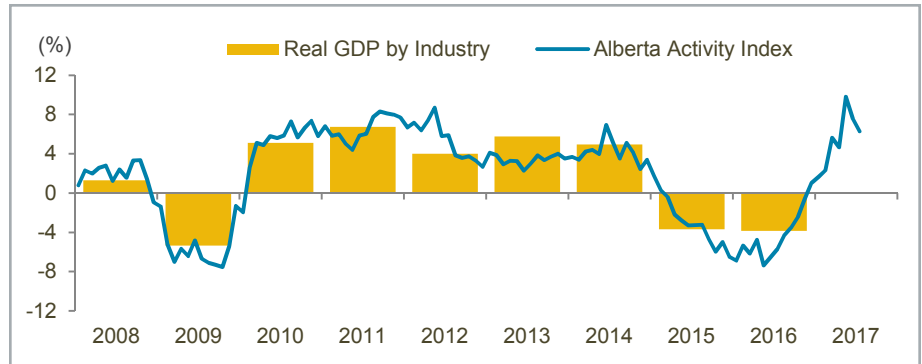
Alberta's unemployment rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 7.9% in September. Canada's unemployment rate held steady at 6.2%.

### Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 127 in September, up 60% y/y. Year-to-date, the number of active rigs has average 127, nearly double the amount in 2016.

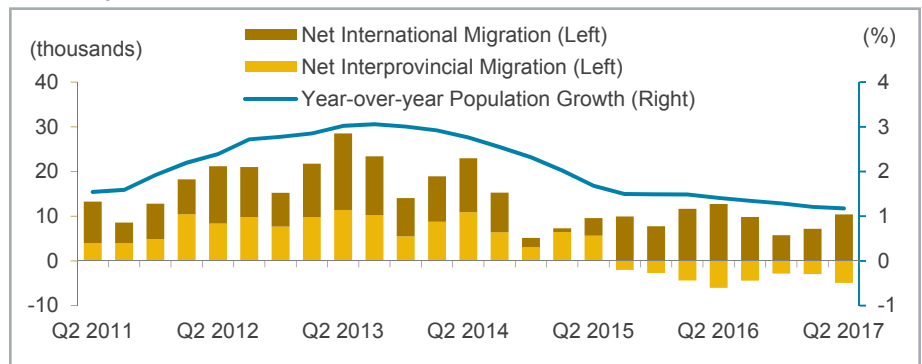
Year-over-year % change

### Demographics

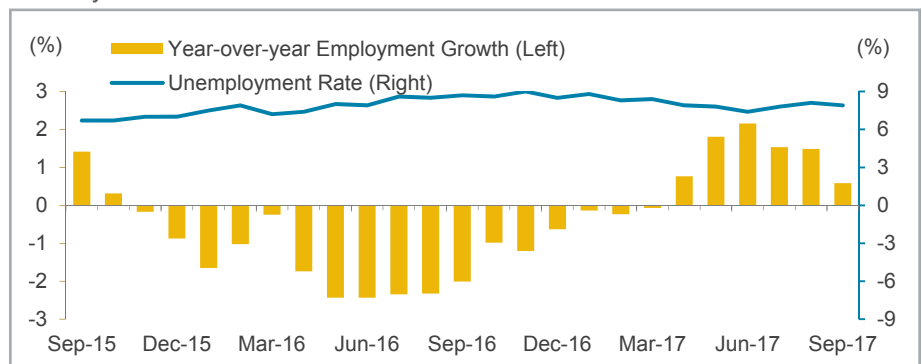

### Inflation

The Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 1.1% y/y in August, up from 1.0% in July, as energy prices increased. The Canadian inflation rate also ticked up in August to 1.4%.

### Average Weekly Earnings<sup>1</sup>

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta fell by 0.9% in July to \$1,125. Earnings are virtually unchanged from a year ago as higher earnings in the service sector (+2.4% y/y) are offset by lower earnings in the goods sector (-5.1% y/y).

### Retail Sales<sup>1</sup>

Alberta retail sales decreased by 0.6% m/m to \$6.8 billion in July. Retail sales grew 9.5% y/y, the eighth consecutive month of year-over-year gains.

### Housing Starts<sup>1</sup>

Alberta housing starts fell 22% m/m in August to 26,154 units (annualized). Housing starts increased 33% y/y, with both single-family and multi-family starts up 51% y/y and 22% y/y, respectively.

### New Housing Price Index

Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) increased 0.5% in July and was unchanged from a year ago. The house-only component was down 0.3% y/y, while land prices was up 0.4% y/y.

### Building Permits<sup>1</sup>

Alberta building permits were down 6.5% m/m in July to \$1.0 billion. Building permits were down 9.0% y/y. Non-residential permits dropped 30% y/y and residential permits increased 9.3% y/y.

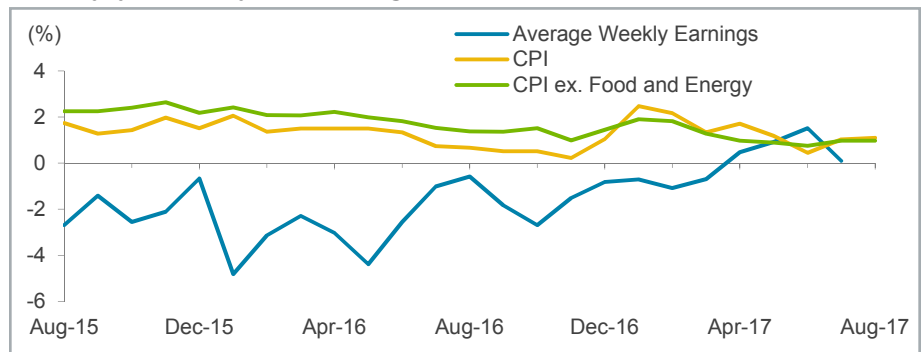

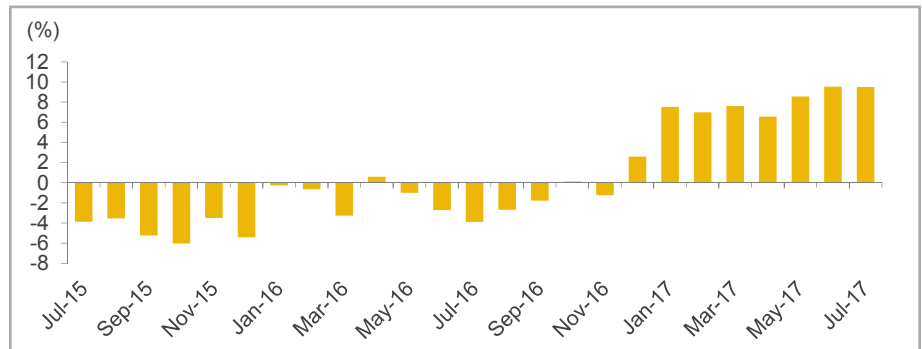
Monthly, year-over-year % change

### Retail Sales

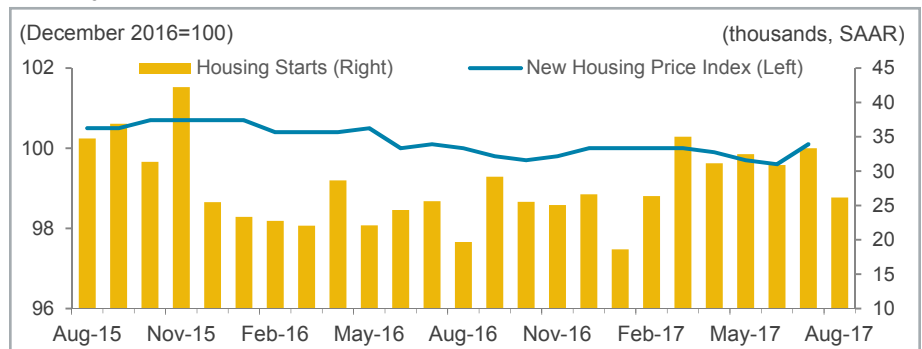
Monthly, year-over-year % change

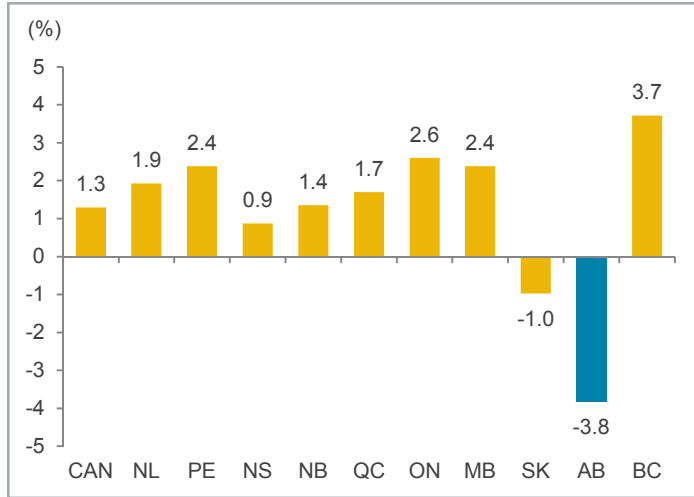

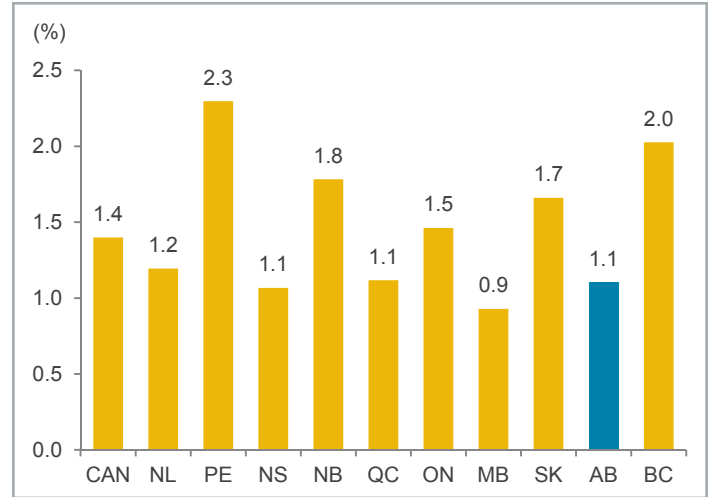
### Real GDP by Industry

(2016, year-over-year growth)



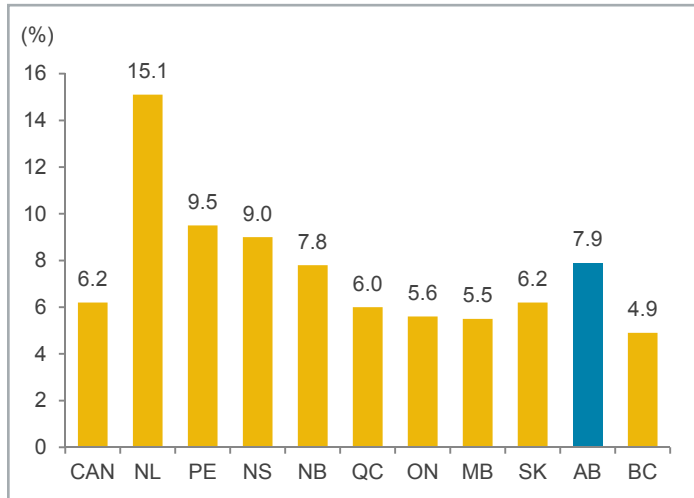
### CPI Inflation

(July 2017, year-over-year growth)



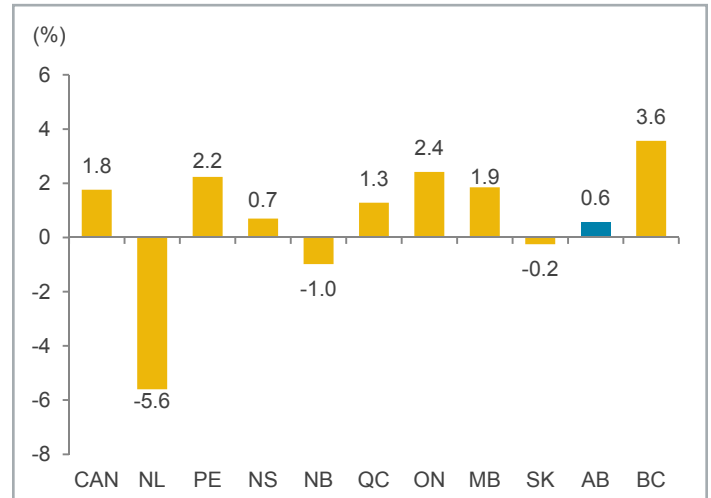
### Unemployment Rate

(September 2017)



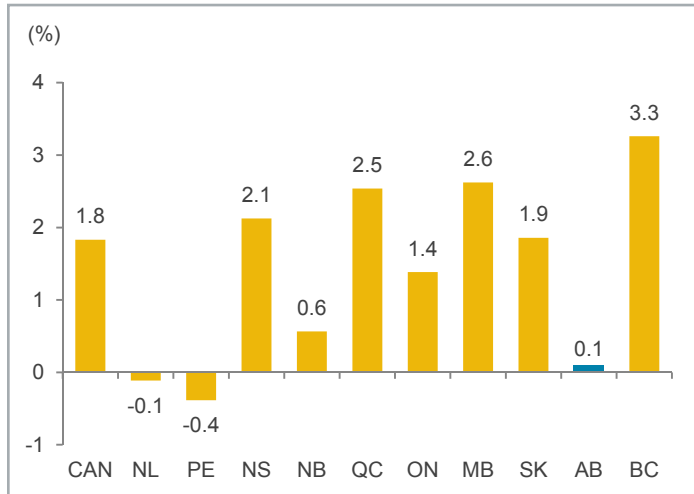
### Employment

(September 2017, year-over-year growth)



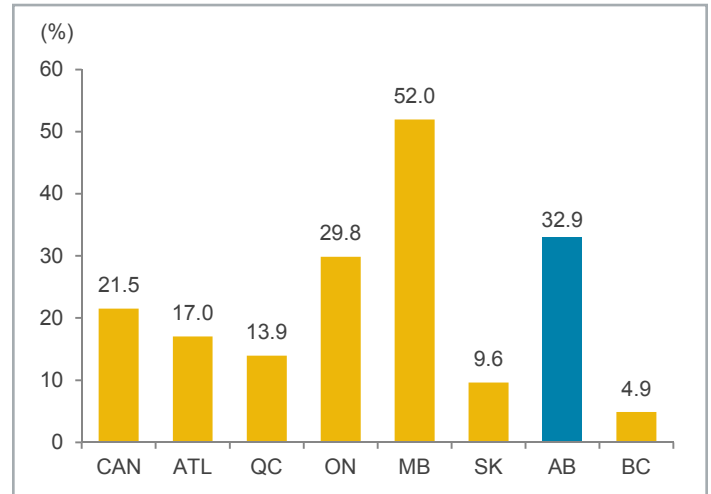
### Average Weekly Earnings
