

Alberta Economy

Indicators at a Glance

Economic Activity

The Alberta Activity Index (AAX) was up 4.4% year-over-year (y/y) in January, due mainly to increased business activity. Alberta's real GDP by expenditure fell by 3.7% in 2016, the largest drop among the provinces for the second year in a row.

Population

Alberta's population was 4,318,772 as of January 1, 2018, an increase of 1.4% from the year prior. Canada's population grew 1.3% from a year ago.

Migration

Net migration to Alberta was 5,599 in the fourth quarter of 2017. During this time, Alberta welcomed 5,297 net international migrants, while there was a net inflow of interprovincial migrants (+302) for the second consecutive quarter after eight quarters of outflows.

Employment¹

The economy added 8,300 jobs in March, the strongest monthly job gains so far in 2018. Employment rose 1.8% y/y, reflecting employment gains in both self-employment (+5.3% y/y) and full-time work (+2.5% y/y).

Unemployment Rate¹

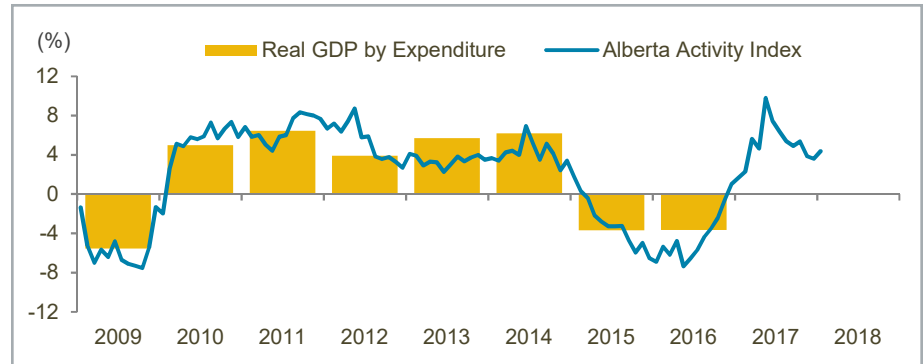
The strong employment gain pushed Alberta's unemployment rate down by 0.4 percentage point to 6.3% in March. Canada's unemployment rate stood unchanged at 5.8%.

Rigs Drilling

The number of active rigs in Alberta averaged 142 in March, down 4.0% y/y. The average rig utilization rate was 34%, unchanged from a year ago.

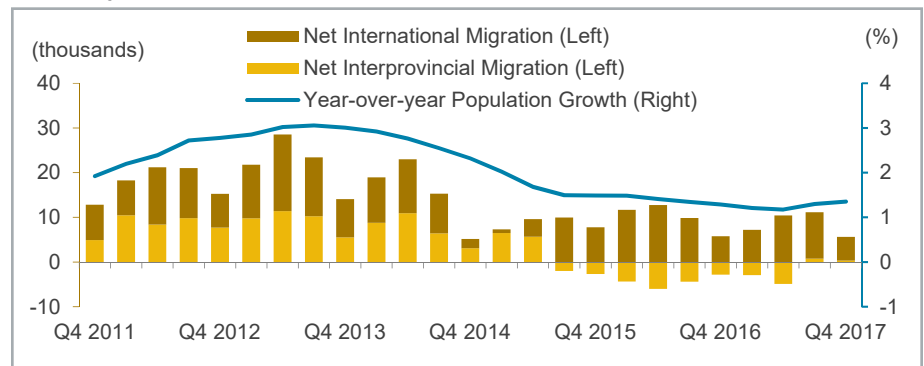
Year-over-year % change

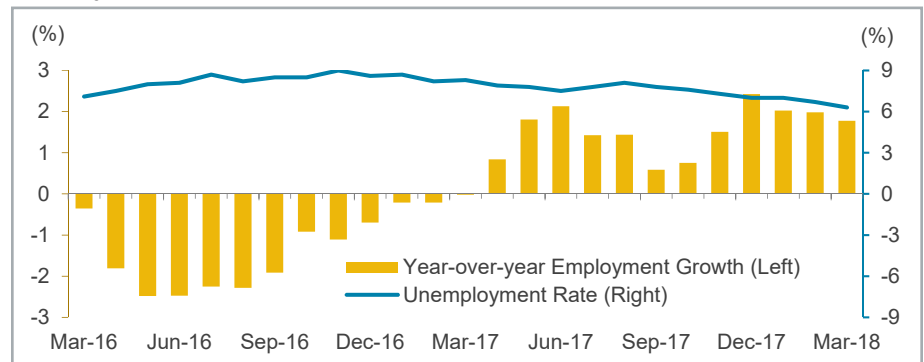

NEW: Inflation

The annual Inflation rate in Alberta ticked higher by 0.1 percentage point to 2.3% y/y in March. Inflation excluding food and energy prices ticked 0.2 percentage point lower to 1.3% y/y.

Average Weekly Earnings¹

Average weekly earnings (AWE) in Alberta ticked down by 0.1% m/m in January to \$1,147. Earnings increased 3.1% y/y driven by increased earnings in both the goods and services sectors.

NEW: Retail Sales¹

Alberta retail sales decreased 0.3% m/m to \$6.7 billion in February. Retail sales were up 0.7% y/y, the fifteenth consecutive month of year-over-year gains.

Housing Starts¹

Alberta housing starts rose by 14.0% m/m in March to 26,972 units (annualized). They were down 22.6% y/y, as declines in multi-family (-38.8% y/y) overwhelmed gains in single-family starts (+6.7% y/y).

New Housing Price Index

In January, Alberta's New Housing Price Index (NHPI) ticked down 0.2% y/y. The house-only component fell (-0.6% y/y) while land prices were up (+0.6% y/y).

Building Permits¹

Alberta building permits were up 13.2% y/y in February to \$1.3 billion, as increased residential permits (+25.1% y/y) more than offset a decline in non-residential permits (-4.3% y/y).

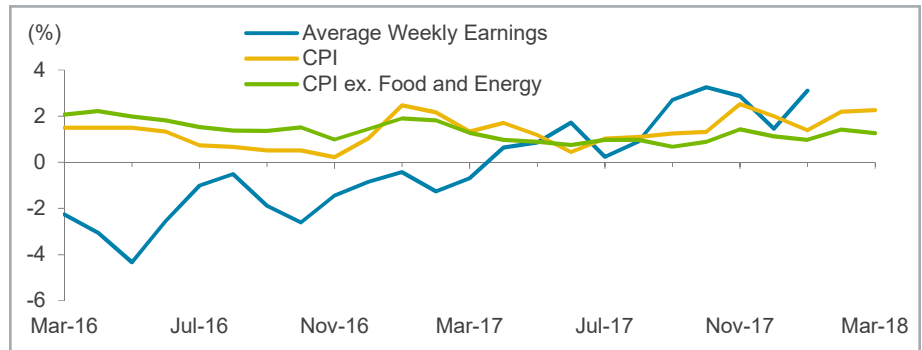

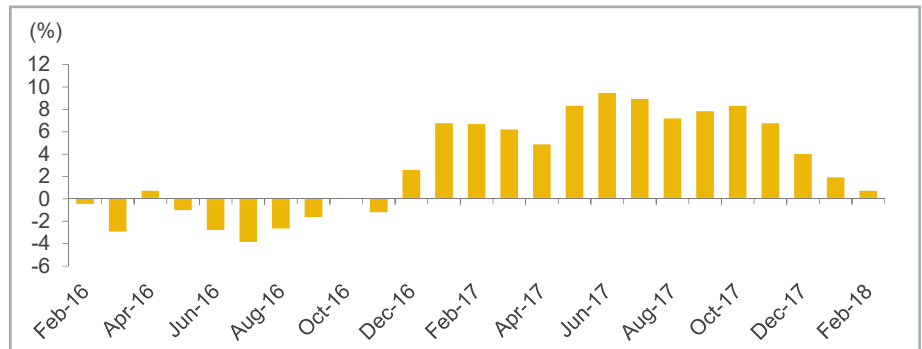
Monthly, year-over-year % change

Retail Sales

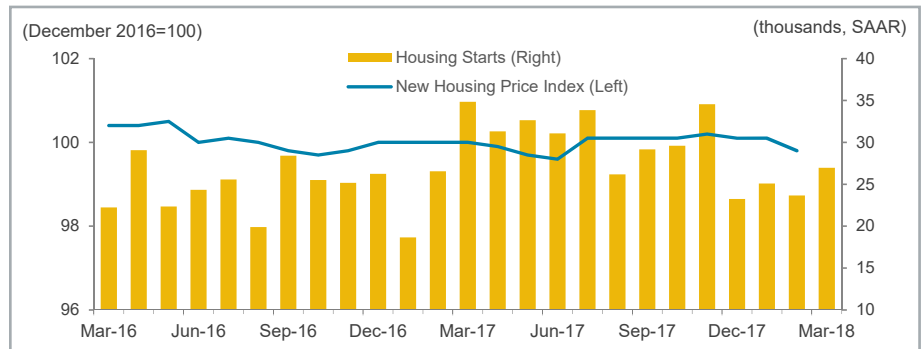
Monthly, year-over-year % change

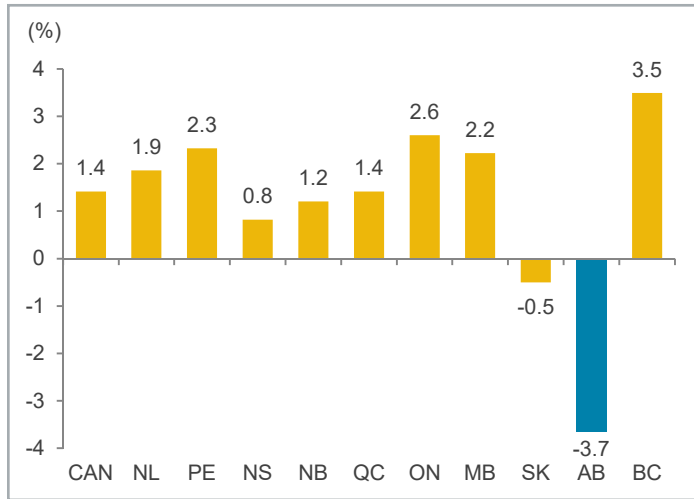

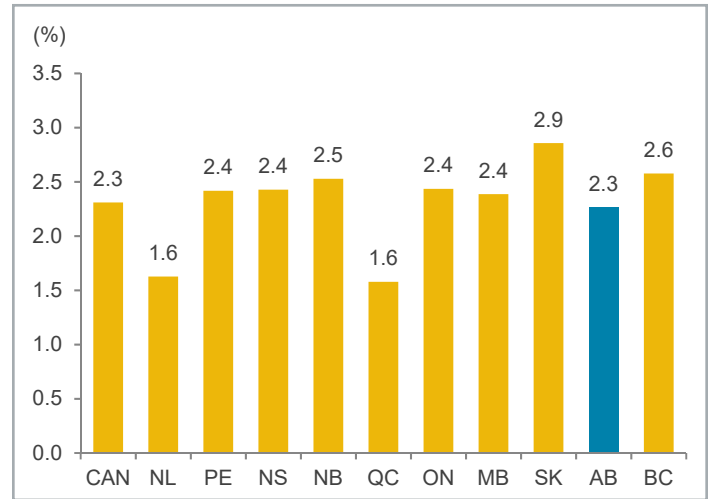
Real GDP by Expenditure

(2016, year-over-year growth)



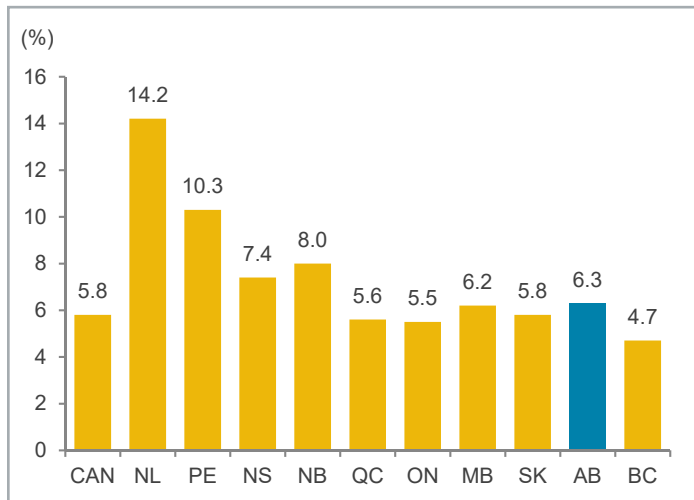
CPI Inflation

(March 2018, year-over-year growth)



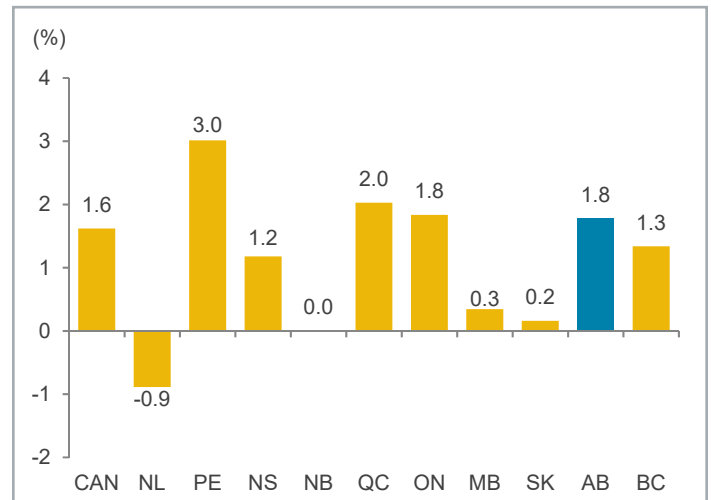
Unemployment Rate

(March 2018)



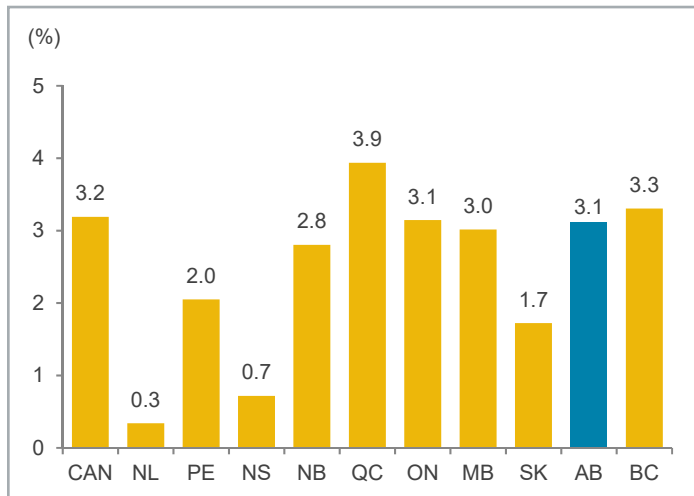
Employment

(March 2018, year-over-year growth)



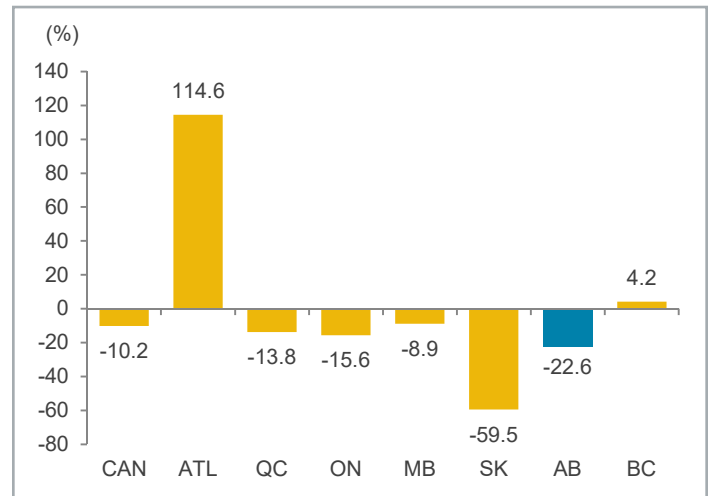
Average Weekly Earnings
